You MUST know about becoming a Bach Flower Practitioner

1. *Do I have to have a valid certificate that's recognised by the Bach Centre?*

No. Your qualification does not need to be recognised by the Bach Centre. There's no regulating authority for the Bach Flowers. I **provide the full details within my [Bach Flower Diploma Course](#)**.

2. *Do I need a certificate to practice legally and to get insurance?*

That depends on the laws within your country. But general...Yes. You'll most likely to need a certificate to be covered by your insurance company. [The Bach Flower School's Diploma Course](#) provides an accredited certificate.

3. *Do I need some form of Continued Professional Development?*

Generally... Yes. It can be a requirement of the insurance policy covering your practice. [The Bach Flower School](#) provides several opportunities for Continued Professional Development each year.

4. *Do I need to be Registered with an Accredited Body in order to Practice?*

No. There is no regulatory body. However, after getting certified most practitioners will register for the benefits registration provides. [The Bach Flower School](#) offers a registration service.

5. *How long does it take to become a Practitioner?*

In the case of The Bach Flower School, it is a prerequisite of taking the Practitioner's Diploma course that you've taken a Foundation course (or have at least 6 months experience of using the remedies). You'll need 4 months to do the Diploma course work, the tests and assessments.
